Get real! Cling to the reality of the Resurrection.

How can we not be amazed?!

- The Greeks dismissed Paul and his notion of a bodily resurrection.
- Just this past week I heard a Christian pastor dismiss it as fantasy.
- Even we who believe it wonder about it or go weeks w/o thinking of it

Don't go weeks without thinking about it!

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- ❖ Jesus' voice can raise the dead
 - Very truly I tell you, a time is coming and has now come when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear will live. v. 25
 - Amen! Amen! Pay attention! You can count on this stake your life
 - Note: *has now come*. Jesus, the Son of God, came to do this.
 - The Gospel records 3 resurrections at the voice of Jesus
 - vs. 24 is key to understanding this
 - Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life. v. 24
 - Jesus' good news produces the 1st Resurrection faith/spiritual life
 - Faith's new life is eternal life the New Self in fellowship w/ God
 - All believers have eternal life life that passes through death's door
 - How? Jesus has life in himself he is the Source of life.
 - That's why Jesus, only Jesus, can give life. That's where the Father put it.
 - will hear: active verb continue to hear, the character of the living
 - The voice/words of Jesus (faithfully proclaimed) gives/feeds eternal life
 - It works even when you don't sense or feel it.
- ❖ Jesus' voice will call everyone out of their grave on Judgment Day
 - Do not be amazed at this, for a time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice and come out... v. 28-29a
 - Aren't these words simple and clear? Jesus' voice will raise their bodies.
 - ...the dust returns to the ground it came from, and the spirit returns to God who gave it. Eccles. 12:7
 - ◆ The soul/spirit returns to God for judgment. Heb. 9:27
 - Thief on the cross Rich man and poor Lazarus it's heaven or hell
 - The physical body (dust) alone remains in the grave.

- The physical resurrection is the Gospel. No resurrection = no hope.
 - ◆ ¹⁴ For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. ... ¹⁶ For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first (before the living are taken). 1 Thess. 4
 - In 1 Corinthians 15 Paul shows: no physical resurrection = no hope
 - If there's no physical resurrection, then Jesus didn't physically rise.
 - If Jesus didn't rise we're all in sin, our faith is useless, we're pitiful
 - But Jesus rose first. When Jesus returns he'll raise the sleeping
- Jesus is the judge. His verdict is final forever.
- ◆ ²⁷ And he has given him authority to judge because he is the Son of Man. ²⁸ "Do not be amazed at this, for a time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice ²⁹ and come out those who have done what is good will rise to live, and those who have done what is evil will rise to be condemned. vs. 27-29
- ...judge because he is the Son of Man the Messiah King, the Savior
 - Those who listen to Jesus/God's Word have life, they belong to him
- Those who viewed Jesus & the Father with contempt judged by that
- ◆ have done what is good... have done what is evil
 - Scary for us sinners. We know our sins which he fully paid for!
 - Like Matt. 25 Jesus is pointing to the evidence, fruits of life/death
 - $\ ^{\square}$ Chief fruits of faith: confess X, listen to X, love X's people.
 - evil bad, base, worthless. Not done in worship of the Source.
 Used God's gifts to glorify anyone/anything other than Jesus.
 - These words are used in the Athanasian Creed. Remember this.
- Only 2 outcomes: rise resulting in **life** or **condemnation**
 - Life = enjoying or participating in God's blessings with him
 - " ...in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, where righteousness dwells. 2 Peter 3:13
 - Condemnation/contempt from God, other, self. Loathing corruption
- This is real. Cling to the reality of the Resurrection.
 - It's our ultimate goal. Live amazed at this reality. Death can't shake it.
- Don't compromise it when dealing with the death of others.
 - False comfort for those who had no time for Jesus and his word
 - $\ ^{\square}$ False hope blunts God's call to repentance to those living.
 - $\ ^{\square}$ They shift your own hope maybe all or most will get to heaven
 - Offer genuine comfort: *I care. Let's get together and talk.* Focus on giving the gospel's comfort, not *the answers* before the gospel.

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
