## Covet Joseph's liberation from abuse. Discover the transformational power of God's forgiveness.

- ❖ A lot of public talk people dealing with a history of abuse.
  - Joseph knew abuse from brothers, Potiphar's wife, forgetful cup-bearer
  - Well that's easy for Joseph to deal with in his lap of luxury.
    - Really? Many successful/prosperous people suffer from past abuse.
  - What's the difference? How you choose to deal with your abuse.
    - Joseph's secret: Yahweh's reliable mercy transformed his view of life.
- ❖ God's mercy is more than our hope for a favorable eternal residence
  - Yes, it assures us our sins are wiped out and we are children of God.
  - *Child of God* is a legal standing for our assurance. But it's also what God wants to transform us into to liberate us from sin's viewpoint.
    - People set free from obsessing on justice, what's fair, retribution and vengeance. You hurt me. You'll pay. Anger, bitterness, etc. sin wins!
      - God has a right to demand justice. We owe him perfect obedience.
      - Yet it isn't his preferred way to deal with us. It doesn't help & save us.
    - Justice will not help and save your abuser either. Nor save you from a heart of hate - a deadly poisonous point of view.
  - $\bullet\,$  As God leads you to delight in his mercy freed from his just wrath
  - ◆ he wants to liberate your heart from a justice/fair view of life and living
- ❖ God liberates you from the burden of being your own savior/defender.
  - Abuse attacks a sense of safety & well being.
    - Feeling powerless. If only I were in charge they'd never hurt me!
  - Really friend? Is that the solution? Are you a god, let alone God?
    - You are not and never will be! *In control* is a **false** solution.
  - Learn what Joseph learned. Faith confidently says:
    - I know Yahweh loves me. He promises to be my Savior. He is God.
      - I don't know why God is allowing this to happen to me, but he knows.
      - He has not forgotten me. He's still in control of all things.
    - I rely on him and serve him waiting to see how:
      - he is working to bless me
      - and through me and these events to bless others.
  - Let go and let God be God. Not fatalist! Know and trust his promises.

- ❖ Look how that not only allowed Joseph to survive his abuse, but thrive in the midst of his abuse (unfair treatment) and beyond.
  - He whistled while he worked. What's with this guy?!
  - 19 But Joseph said to them, "Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God?
    20 You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives.

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- ❖ Why did Joseph's brothers come with this request?
  - guilt fear knowing what they would do in Joseph's place
  - Thinking Joseph forgave for the sake of their father, not Heavenly Father
- ❖ Why did Joseph sob?
  - That his brothers didn't know/believe his forgiveness was full and free?
  - Because his brothers lacked the spiritual maturity and impact of God's mercy to liberate them from guilt & fear?
    - Thinking *forgiveness* is obligation, social norm, or tactical
  - Joseph wanted his brothers to know God's transformative forgiveness
    - 20 You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives. 21 So then, don't be afraid. I will provide for you and your children." And he reassured them and spoke kindly to them.
    - God's transforming forgiveness liberates us from:
      - guilt & fear
      - the burden to make life work for my good playing God
      - a law and justice view of life to life freed from sin by God's mercy
