Encourage one another. It can't wait.

- The End of the World
 - Not long ago the stuff of fiction. If serious: viewed as a religious nut
 - Fears of climate change many openly speak of the end of the world
 - Yet tell people the Universe will suddenly pass away labeled: *religious nut*
 - Face it. The notion of climate change is scary enough.
 - Everything we know and have vanish. That's even scarier!
 - Therefore, encourage one another with these words. 1 Th. 4:18
 - Therefore, encourage one another and build each other up... 1 Th. 5:11
 - What's so encouraging about the *End of the World*?
 - Everything! When you know what's going to happen and are prepared.

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• Encourage? Part of the problem - thinking encourage = speak only the positive, get people to *believe in themselves*.

***** Encourage, speaking truth against deception.

- Paul exposes false encouragement: people are saying, "Peace and security,"
 - Deception: Don't worry. Nothing's going to happen in our lifetime.
 - It hasn't happened in 2,000 years. Nothing indicates that all will end.
 - Definition of encourage: to give support, confidence, or hope
 - False hope, false confidence isn't encouragement. It's deadly deception.
- Encouragement must speak the truth so people aren't left unprepared.
 - Fact: The Day of the Lord is coming. Jesus will return on the Last Day
 - There will be **no hints or signs.** It will be **sudden instantaneous.**
 - You can't stop it or ask for a little more time to prepare.
 - Destruction (total ruin) will suddenly come on the deniers and unprepared.
 - The truth is a message that cares and prepares that provides true support.
 - Avoiding the scary news of the End of the World is **not** helpful or loving.
 - Be encouraged to speak the truth, to encourage others to prepare.

***** Encourage: the ultimate life begins with the Day of the Lord.

- Most stunning news. This is not the day to dread! God's people live for this day.
 - Sin, its deeds, deceptions, afflictions, destruction, additions GONE!
 - The curse of sin pain, disease, aging, disability, deterioration, death GONE!
 - Satan, the cruel prince of this world, his demonic and human allies GONE!
 - Our sinful nature the Old Self GONE! We're cured of it forever!
 - Sin's reign is over. Our loving God is in charge and we are with him.
 - He died for us, so that ...we may live together with him.
 - Live with him in a New perfect Creation forever! Wonder of wonders.
 - Encouragement for the Last Day goes far beyond avoiding destruction.

- How do we know you're included?
 - Do you know that Jesus died in your place so you could be with God forever?
 - Do you know that Jesus is returning out with the Old and in with the New?
 - Do you regret your deeds of darkness and long to grow as a child of light?
 - Do you know that God gave you a new birth in Baptism, making you one of his own a child of the light?
 - There's your proof. God worked this knowledge and affirmation in you.
 - You see, God did not appoint us for wrath, but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. God has <u>encouraged</u> you!

***** Live to encourage one another

- Encourage your comrades. We are engaged in a war.
 - A war against the Deceiver and all who offer *false peace*.
 - Encourage one another to be alert and sober not asleep or out of it.
 - Equip one another with *faith*, *love*, *and hope*. Train how to use them.
 - *Faith* trust in God and his word. Stand on solid ground. Resist temptation.
 - *Love* faith in action, following the word, living in the light.
 - ^D A taste of the perfection that awaits with the Day of the Lord.
 - *Hope* confidence and longing for all God promises now and then.
 - As our helmet: on our mind, providing focus and longing for the ultimate
 - [•] It protects from cheap glittery false promises that beckon from the darkness.
 - Hope doesn't need to know the *when Jesus comes*. It knows he is coming.
 - Those who want to know *when*, want to be in charge = hope in self

Encourage one another. It can't wait.

- Joint worship is encouragement in action, equipping to encourage
 - All who participate in hymns, liturgy, Psalms, prayers, Creed, and Communion
 - Encourage others. And tune and equip their lips with words of encouragement
 - Are encouraged by those they worship with also authors and composers
 - What a privilege to *encourage one another and build each other up...*
- Our calling to encourage one another is vital for others and ourselves.
 - No one else will help you be prepared. Going solo neglects others and self.
 - How foolish to take a day off from hope! Forget the ultimate we live for.
 - Take what you learn from joint worship and Bible reading, speak it out loud to yourself in the shower, in devotions, in prayer.
 - Then let it flow into your conversations with fellow believers to encourage.
 - Share it with those who don't know Jesus.
 - People need real hope. We have it to offer free of charge.

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
