Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43 August 2, 2020

Rejoice, discovering why Jesus said, "No, not yet!"

- What joy to look over a newly planted field/garden seeing the crop come up.
- Joy turns to consternation when weeds show up.
 - Grandpa's passion: Thistles and Milkweed. Get those weed seeds!
 - Dandelion, Hairy Bittercrest, common yellow oxalis mine. Seeds spread.
- Note the response of the servants to the presence of the *weeds* in the wheat field.
 - False wheat, poison darnel looks & acts like wheat, toxic from a fungus
 - Zeal to make the field flawless. Master: Not yet. The reapers will deal with it.

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- ❖ Grieve over wickedness, but **don't** seek to exterminate now.
 - Here people under God's influence live next to those under Satan's influence
 - God's children are troubled by and grieve over:
 - everything that causes sin things that entice, then trap in sin
 - those who continue to break the law live lawless, contempt for law
 - Enlightened by the word, we know sin is bad and God's ways liberate
 - Grieve to see sin normalized, enticing the naive (children) into a trap
 - Glorifying gangs, seeking to *belong*. Mass killings to be *known a someone*.
 - Thuggery to make a living, a lifestyle of pleasure, become wealthy.
 - Glorifying the party scene of *fun* as *the life*. Drunk, high, altered states.
 - Provocative dress and talk, scheming to get pregnant without marriage, living together without marriage, abortion as *birth control*.
 - Seeing pleasure through pornography as normal. In fact highly destructive.
 - Lawlessness and injustice
 - Rioting and looting destroying neighborhoods, livelihoods, the vulnerable
 - Drug trafficking, sex trafficking, kidnapping for ransom
 - Oppression of classes and cultures: minorities in America (Chinese, Japanese, Native American, people of color); Rohingya of Myanmar, Uighurs of China, humanitarian disaster of Yemen and Syria. Oppression of Christians in Nigeria, Pakistan, China, Indonesia and on and on.
 - God's people grieve over sin's entrapment and contempt of right and wrong
 - We cry out: *How long, Lord?* Why don't you put a stop to it?
 - Should Christians put a stop to blatant sin?
 - History if full of *Christians* with false zeal, seeking to fix with law & sword
 - Crusades, Inquisition, KKK, killing abortionists
 - Here Jesus teaches us it's not our job to rid the world of sin. That's God's job.
 - Romans 12: ¹⁸ If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, maintain peace with everyone. ¹⁹ Do not take revenge, dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath. For it is written, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay," says the Lord.
 - Romans 13 God deals with evildoers through the State, his servants
 - But there is no such thing as a Christian State imposing Christian behavior

- Jesus reveals God's plan and thinking.
 - God removes people under the Devil's rule and influence on the Last Day
 - Concern and care for God's people is the reason it doesn't happen now.
 - 'No, because when you gather up the weeds, you might pull up the wheat along with them. ³⁰ Let both grow together until the harvest,
 - While, we know the harmful influences of sin, many believers would be severely harmed if unbelieving family and friends were yanked out now.
 - Lives disrupted, poverty, weak faith disturbed, anger, confusion...
 - Judgment is delayed for the sake of believers God is merciful.
 - Elsewhere we learn, grace is extended to the wicked, time to be rescued from living under Satan's reign, lies, and captivity. Again, God's mercy is shown.

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- * Rejoice, God's justice and deliverance will prevail.
 - Our longing to be rescued from the heartache, temptation, assaults of sin is good.
 - That's God's desire for us and his ultimate promise fully rescued from sin.
 - God's creation rightfully belongs to him and his children. Sin must be removed.
 - This means God will extract all under the reign of wickedness and the Devil
 - Matthew 25 reveals the angels will gather them before Jesus
 - There the sharp clear verdict will be spoken *Depart cursed*.
 - Their love for sin and lies contempt of God, righteousness, and truth expose them as not belonging with God and his people. Not blessed! Cursed.
 - It is **just** to get what they demanded separation from God & all that's right
 - ...the fiery furnace where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.
 - Gnashing of teeth: grinding expression of scorn, anger, or pain
 - ^a Eternal bitterness, blaming God & others. Their sin nature is fully exposed.
 - This is the only way we can be delivered from everything saturated by sin.
 - We know this is what our sin deserved. Praise God Jesus endured this for us.
 - God's people aren't better. We're made new by Jesus, through faith.
 - God rescued us from sin here, making us children of God's kingdom.
 - We live under the influence and reign of righteousness, truth, Jesus.
 - By conversion, our eyes are opened. We see sin is bad, righteousness is good.
 - The fullest extent of God's saving work will become clear.
 - Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father.
 - God will have fully remade us in his likeness free of all sin's perversions.
 - Not only will we be liberated from sinners next to us, but sin inside of us!
 - All who delight in such an eternity long to grow in righteousness now.
 - Whoever has ears to hear, let him hear.
 - As we grieve over all the evil and injustice, Jesus gives us reason to rejoice.
 - Let us hear, least evil lure us and entrap us, separating us from Jesus.
 - Let us hear, so we partner with Jesus on his rescue mission now.
 - Encourage God's children to remain in Christ and grow.
 - Reach out with the gospel to rescue people from Satan's traps. Now is mercy!

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It liberates us and others.
