Saints, fix your eyes on the real reality of all saints.

- Huddled in hiding or down below the arena in prison, they heard the roar of the arena
 - another Christian beheaded, blood pouring on the sand
 - the ruler and people claiming victory for their gods
 - Hard to imagine: a Christian who told you about Jesus, encouraged you in Christ
 - Hard to imagine coming to claim the severed body and head for burial.
- Christians in Nigeria, Pakistan, China, India and elsewhere know the threats
- This world says, Seeing is believing. What is seen is reality, period!
- The Spirit and Christ, through this vision invites us to see the full picture of reality.
 - 3 verses that pull back the curtain for us to see the real reality current and eternal

Saints, fix your eyes on the real reality of all saints.

- Fix your eyes on the martyrs in glory. They didn't lose! They are the real victors.
 - A lifeless, beaten, severed body looks defeated.
 - Look here. The souls of those who confessed Christ to the end they live!
 - They lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years.
 - NIV, CSB, NASB translate, they came to life. But that's not the Greek word
 - EHV, KJV, NET translate correctly: they lived kept on living
 - The souls of those made alive through faith in Christ never die.
 - The soul new self has eternal life that passes right through the door of death
 - In this life with Christ and Christ with them. That continues uninterrupted.
 - This is true of all believers. Spoken here of the martyrs to encourage the mourners.
 - They do not just keep on living in glory, but reigned with Christ.
 - No longer subjects of their oppressors. They are now in charge with Jesus.
 - How this works and what they do is hidden from us. But it is still real.
 - Clearly they are not defeated. They did not lose! They came out on top.
 - What about the 1000 years?
 - It's simple. 10 = complete. $10^3 = \text{absolutely perfectly complete}$
 - God's perfectly complete New Testament era the fullness of time
 - Sadly from these few verses the fanciful tale of the Millennium is spun
 - □ Nowhere in the Bible, not even here, does it say Jesus will reign from Jerusalem
 - ¹ That notion defies Jesus' words to Pilate, My kingdom is not of this world.
 - Jesus' reign would never threatened a Herod, Pilate, Caesar, or any such.
 - You can't make a peaceable kingdom on this cursed creation of corrupted people.
 - Countless religious experiments have proven how right Scripture is.
 - Jesus was clear. The next time he returns it's Judgment Day not a Millennium!
 - Celebrating All Saints' Day fix your eyes on the real reality of all saints.
 - Look at those who faced death for Christ.
 - Heaven was not a consolation prize for giving up their life. It was their goal!
 - Our heavenly goal is not a perfect Caribbean paradise trouble free leisure.
 - ¹ *Life* is found in and with Christ. We taste it now. See it there in full!
 - □ Those who lived without Jesus, then come to know him, know the difference.

- The more we see what the saints have, the more it becomes our life purpose/goal
 - When Jesus is our joy, peace, glory, hope, life we'd die rather than forsake him
 - Fixing our focus on the martyred saints with Christ, we are moved to press on.
 - Their bloodied bodies, skeletons, and graves are not the whole picture of reality.
 - □ The real, full, and eternal reality is seen here. Pull back the curtain. Fix your eyes.
 - ^a Let it renew and move you to run the race with purpose and perseverance.
- * Fix your eyes on the real reality of all the saints all who share in the *first resurrection*.
 - first resurrection conversion, baptism, new life eternal life. John 3-5, Romans 6
 - first death death of the body second death eternally residing in hell
 - *second resurrection* all raised, some to life, rest to eternal death separation from God & every blessing, an eternity devoid of good, full of shame, pain, hopelessness
 - Blessed and holy is the one who has a share in the first resurrection. The second death has no power over them. Instead they will be priests of God and of Christ. And they will reign with him for a thousand years.
 - Clearly this would apply to the martyrs and all in heaven. But also to us.
 - All raised to new life in baptism who continue to *share in the first resurrection*.
 - □ All those alive through faith, not having lost it by neglect and unbelief.
 - We are **blessed** objects of God's blessings, his doing not ours! (Matthew 5 & 25:34)
 - We are *holy* declared righteous and clothed with Christ's righteousness
 - By faith we are counted among *All Saints* marvelously knit together, 1 Communion
 - Hell has no power over us the gates of hell will not overpower the Church. Mt 16:18
 - We are *priests of God and of Christ*
 - Mediators: Intercessors on behalf of others Speaking God's word to people
 - This applies to those in glory. It seems likely they are praying for us!
 - Offering prayers of praise and thanksgiving.
 - Brought into Christ's kingdom in mysterious ways we reign with Christ.
 - Exercising his kingdom's authority:
 - Not with laws of Christian morality or guns to advance his reign!
 - But with the word proclaimed, extending his reign, keeping God's people safe, advancing his gracious rule in the hearts and minds of God's people.
 - Paul spoke of our reign in Romans 16: ¹⁹ Your obedience has become known to everyone, so I am very joyful about you. But I want you to continue to be wise about what is good, and innocent about what is evil. ²⁰ The God of peace will soon crush Satan under your feet.
 - It is God and his kingdom that work this way. What a marvel we are part of it!
 - For you are included among All Saints.
 - At times your sight, intuition, feeling, and reason may not affirm this reality. That's when you turn to Revelation 20:4-6 for the Spirit to say,

Saints, fix your eyes on the real reality of all saints.
