The sending the 12: More than history! Public Ministry.

- Clearly history. Classic Mark: brief, action, bare facts. Just history? No!
- Prescriptive to us how we are to do it? No! Instruction to the 12 at that time.
 - The night of Jesus' arrest he recalls this and offers future instructions. Luke 22:35-36

The sending the 12: More than history! Public Ministry.

Chosen and sent by Jesus with his authority

- When Jesus invited them to be his protégés (disciples): make you fishers of men
 - fishers of men gathering people to God
- Later Jesus chose the 12 Apostles (ones sent) from among his disciples
 - Apostle: implies the authority of the Sender
 - Sent to speak on behalf of the One who sent them to share **his** message.
- He gave them authority over the unclean spirits.
 - Authority Jesus had as the Christ his to give
 - 12 They went out and **preached** that people should repent. 13 They also **drove out many demons**. They anointed many sick people with oil and **healed** them.
 - Their work reveals the full authority Jesus gave
 - ⁷ As you go, preach this message: 'The kingdom of heaven is near!' ⁸ Heal the sick. Raise the dead. Cleanse lepers. Drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give. Matthew 10
- The message Jesus gave them was God's word
 - God's word is full of his power and authority to change hearts and minds
 - *Repent* = a gospel imperative with God's power to turn fleshly thinking into seeing & desiring the blessing of God's reign/kingdom/way of operating
 - The role of miracles: confirm that the message and messenger are from God.
- Jesus still sends Ministers (Servants) of his word today.
 - Jesus Ascended to rule all things in part to send *the apostles, ...evangelists, ...* pastors and teachers Ephesians 4:11
 - Jesus calls them to faith, moves to offer self, equips, trains, and then calls
 - Jesus calls for Public Ministry through his church his gathered followers.
 - Every follower of Jesus is called to share Jesus in their own life with others.
 - To serve in public ministry, on behalf of the church the church calls.
 - Servants of Jesus' word speaking the word with Christ's authority.

❖ Sent to confirm and model trust in God's care

- Jesus' instructions here to the 12 designed to confirm their trust in God's promises
- Go as you are. Pack nothing for your needs. Watch. God will provide.
- Our Heavenly Father provides through the people overjoyed with the gospel.
 - A heart liberated from guilt and fear by God's full free forgiveness gives
 - Hearts transformed by God's love, loves others, eager to help others hear.
 - They want the messenger of the word to stay and share more.
 - Like Lydia: "If you consider me a believer in the Lord, come and stay at my house." And she persuaded us. Acts 16:15

- The Apostles needed to experience God's faithful care. Trained for ministry.
 - 35 [Jesus] said to them, "When I sent you out without money bag, traveler's bag, and sandals, did you lack anything?" "Nothing," they said. 36 Then he told them, "But now, let the one who has a money bag take it, and likewise a traveler's bag. And let the one who has no sword sell his cloak and buy one. Luke 22:35-36
- The Apostles also modeled trust in God as they came with the bare word.
 - Repent is a call to trust God and his word. They practiced what they preached.
 - The new heart of faith trusts God to be my God, confident of his perfect care.
 - They didn't go to make a living. They brought life, trusting God to provide.

God's people welcome his word and its messengers.

- ¹⁰He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave that area. ¹¹Any place that will not receive you or listen to you, as you leave there, shake off the dust that is under your feet as a testimony against them."
- Here's an important reality: The way you treat God's word is how you treat God. The way you treat a Minister of God's word is the way you treat God.
 - Welcome, delight in, trust, respect, love, devotion to the word the same to God.
 - Those who respect, love, and trust God will respect God's gifts: the Servant of the word and God's word that his servant brings.
 - A Minister of the Word speaks with God's authority when he speaks God's word.
 - God's people are called to recognize false preachers and those teaching error and respectfully point out their error. Then leave and put themselves under the care of a faithful Servant of God's word.
 - □ This may not be easy or convenient, but God and his Word are everything.
- **Note**: when the town doesn't welcome the word don't just leave saying nothing.
 - Any place that will not receive you or listen to you, as you leave there, shake off the dust that is under your feet as a testimony against them."
 - You are left on your own. You wanted nothing to do with God. So be it.
 - It was a sign of God disowning them calling them to repent before it's too late.
 - This is not an act of hatred or disrespect. It *speaks the truth out of care*.
 - An experienced WELS pastor told the story calling on an absent member
 - Knocked repeatedly. Clear evidence the man was home, but not answering
 - He started to walk away, paused, returned and wiped his shoes on the doormat.
 - As he started to walk away, the door opened. What's that all about?
 - Pastor returned and explained: It was a testimony that you rejected the word.
 - The man invited him in, heard the word, repented, & returned to hear the word to do what God's people do welcome God's word, recognizing its authority.
 - It's not about us being right. It's about God's word making us whole.
 - □ Those who treasure God's word know it never stops working wonders.
 - □ Those who treasure God's word treasure God's Public Ministers of the Word.
- This is real history that teaches us God works through his Servants of the Word.
 - A humbling truth for us who serve in it. A great joy to God's faithful people.
