First Reading Isaiah 43:1–7

In the previous chapter, chapter 42, God tells us of Israel's failure to hear and see God's commands. The Law is forcefully evident. ⁷everyone who is called by my name,



Second Reading

Hebrews 5:7-9

Refrain

The writer of Hebrews reminds us that Jesus cried out as to whether there was another way to save the people than him on the cross. But Jesus' great desire was, "not my will, but yours be done." So, Jesus went to the cross. When our text says that Jesus was made perfect, the text is telling us that Jesus completed his mission and became the source of the believers' salvation to both God's glory and ours.

⁷During the days of Jesus' life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with fervent cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. ⁸Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered ⁹and, once made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him...

Gospel John 12:20–33

In this lesson, Jesus uses the example of a seed. A seed is detached from its plant, falls to the ground, and dies. Yet, this seed results in much fruit. This is what will happen to Jesus. From his death comes millions of believers. Saint Augustine wrote, "The death of Christ was the death of the most fertile grain of wheat." Jesus' purpose is to glorify the name of the Father. God the Father confirms to those listening that he is glorified.

²⁰Now there were some Greeks among those who went up to worship at the festival. ²¹They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, with a request. "Sir," they said, "we would like to see Jesus." ²²Philip went to tell Andrew; Andrew and Philip in turn told Jesus.

²³Jesus replied, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds. ²⁵Anyone who loves their life will lose it, while anyone who hates their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant also will be. My Father will honor the one who serves me.

²⁷"Now my soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it was for this very reason I came to this hour. ²⁸Father, glorify your name!"

Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and will glorify it again." ²⁹The crowd that was there and heard it said it had thundered; others said an angel had spoken to him.

³⁰Jesus said, "This voice was for your benefit, not mine. ³¹Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. ³²And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." ³³He said this to show the kind of death he was going to die.






We lift them up to the Lord.

As he dismisses the communicants, the minister says:


The true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen and preserve you to life everlasting. Go † in peace.


