



FIRST LESSON Exodus 6:2-8 EHV

Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob knew the LORD by that name. They just didn't know his name (reputation) the way it would be revealed in his mighty and merciful deliverance from arrogant Pharaoh.

² Then God spoke to Moses, telling him, "I am the LORD. ³ I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, as God Almighty, but by my name, the LORD, I was not known to them. ⁴ I also established my covenant with them, to give them the land of Canaan, the land where they were residing as aliens. ⁵ I certainly have heard the groaning of the Israelites, whom the Egyptians have enslaved, and I have remembered my covenant.

⁶ "Therefore, tell the Israelites, 'I am the LORD. I will bring you out from under the forced labor of the Egyptians. I will deliver you from being their slaves. I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with great acts of judgment. ⁷ I will take you as my own people, and I will be your God. You will know that I am the LORD your God, the one who brought you out from under the forced labor of the Egyptians. ⁸ I will bring you to the land which I swore with uplifted hand to give to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob. I will give it to you as a possession. I am the LORD."

The one and only God is not known by human investigation. Fools thinks he needs their advice. Let God make himself known to you. His wonders are inexhaustible, even for all eternity.


- Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how untraceable his ways!

M: Lift up your hearts.




M: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION


