



First Reading Hosea 3

To prepare his people for judgement, the Lord had Hosea marry an adulterous woman. Hosea's wife depicted the rebellion of the people. After she had been unfaithful to Hosea, the Lord commanded him to find her and redeem her. In the same way the Lord's love for his people never waned in spite of the unfaithfulness to him. Having received the Lord's judgement, the people ultimately returned to him, only to find that the Lord never stopped seeking them.

<sup>1</sup>The LORD said to me, "Go, show your love to your wife again, though she is loved by another man and is an adulteress. Love her as the LORD loves the Israelites, though they turn to other gods and love the sacred raisin cakes."

<sup>2</sup>So I bought her for fifteen shekels of silver and about a homer and a lethek of barley. <sup>3</sup>Then I told her, "You are to live with me many days; you must not be a prostitute or be intimate with any man, and I will behave the same way toward you."

<sup>4</sup>For the Israelites will live many days without king or prince, without sacrifice or sacred stones, without ephod or household gods. <sup>5</sup>Afterward the Israelites will return and seek the LORD their God and David their king. They will come trembling to the LORD and to his blessings in the last days.

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 2:5–11

In Christ's church, each individual has a personal relationship with God, but also with other in the church. The church is the body. Earlier in this book, we learn that in Corinth a man was involved on an adulterous relationship with his father's wife. This caused grief for the whole body of the church. Paul now encourages the church to seek out this man through a much-needed dose of the law. As this seeking out had its intended effect, Paul wanted the entire body to forgive the man and rejoice with him and halt Satan's plan to overwhelm the man with grief and hopelessness.

<sup>5</sup>If anyone has caused grief, he has not so much grieved me as he has grieved all of you to some extent—not to put it too severely. <sup>6</sup>The punishment inflicted on him by the majority is sufficient. <sup>7</sup>Now instead, you ought to forgive and comfort him, so that he will not be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow. <sup>8</sup>I urge you, therefore, to reaffirm your love for him. <sup>9</sup>Another reason I wrote you was to see if you would stand the test and be obedient in everything. <sup>10</sup>Anyone you forgive, I also forgive. And what I have forgiven—if there was anything to forgive—I have forgiven in the sight of Christ for your sake, <sup>11</sup>in order that Satan might not outwit us. For we are not unaware of his schemes.

Gospel Luke 15:1–10

We are all familiar with the parables of the lost sheep and the lost coin as recorded by Luke. In these parables Jesus calls out the Pharisees and teachers of the law who consider themselves found and not in need of repentance, unlike sinners who have everything to gain by following Jesus. Those who remain defiant in their self-righteousness miss out on the joy God feels whenever one of the lost is found.

<sup>1</sup>Now the tax collectors and sinners were all gathering around to hear Jesus. <sup>2</sup>But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them."

<sup>3</sup>Then Jesus told them this parable: <sup>4</sup>"Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? <sup>5</sup>And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders <sup>6</sup>and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' <sup>7</sup>I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent.




